A note from Our Pastor:

Last week, we started readings in the Gospel of John for the "Bread of Life" discourse. You may be thinking to yourself, but we are in Cycle B, shouldn't we be hearing from Mark? Well yes, but Mark being the shortest of the Gospels is supplemented by John. And not just any part of John, but the important chapter 6 of John, where Jesus discusses the Eucharist. We should pay close attention, as the Eucharist is central to our faith.

In our first reading, we hear of the bread that comes down from Heaven - the mana that they people will collect and eat in the dessert. This bread will cease to come down when the people take the land God has promised them. There is an understanding of the people that God will provide bread for our needs. Jesus really makes this apparent.

Jesus tells us that, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (Jn 6:35) What is the Lord really trying to tell us with that? He is telling us that we will satisfy all of our needs and our desires, if we just turn to him, believe, and have faith.

Jesus is the Eucharist - the Bread of Life that comes down to us from heaven. This is the very bread we consecrate at Mass. Remember the prayers of the Roman Canon:

In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God:
command that these gifts be borne
by the hands of your holy Angel
to your altar on high
in the sight of your divine majesty,
so that all of us, who through this participation at the altar
receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son,
may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing.
